IDEA SCHOLARSHIP

Each year WACAC has the opportunity to support students from an underrepresented background and you have the opportunity to make that difference by helping with promotion of the IDEA scholarship. The Inclusion, Equity, and Access Committee (IAS) manages the IDEA Scholarship each year. This year WACAC and IAS will provide scholarships to first generation, low-income students who are pursuing higher education at a WACAC affiliate school, regardless of citizenship status. Scholarship recipients will receive a one-time award of \$500 to be used towards higher education expenses during the 2021-2022 school year.

There are a few items the review committee is asking from students in order to be considered for this opportunity. To be considered for the scholarship, students must:

- Be of first generation background (Neither of your parent/s has obtained a four-year degree from the U.S. college/university)
- Demonstrate financial need and/or be eligible for free or reduced lunch
- Minimum 3.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA (on a 4 point scale)
- High school senior attending a WACAC member public or private high school in Wisconsin
- Planning to attend a WACAC member 2-year or 4-year public or private college/university

As a reminder, any high school can become a member institution at no cost through the WACAC website and are encouraged to join! We ask students to complete the IDEA scholarship application, submit a resume, activities list and submit transcripts to the committee for consideration. Materials are due to the committee no later than **June 1, 2021** with a decision being made by the end of that month.
